Silver and gold are precious for many reasons. They don't react with many other things and they are also not affected by water. Gold is not affected by the air, but the surface of silver can sometimes become black. Both gold and silver reflect light, so they look shiny. They are soft metals and easy to make lots of different things with. Gold can be stretched into thin layers or even into wires. It can be melted and mixed with other metals to make it harder. Silver and gold can also carry electricity and heat very well.




